



Recycling Centers

Hands Inc. Winthrop (507) 647-5387. Hours: Tues. 8 am to 12 noon, Wed. 12 noon to 4 pm, Fridays 8 am to 12 noon. Materials accepted: Newspaper, glass, plastic, aluminum/tin cans, textiles and cardboard.

Waste Management Recycling Center. Located four miles south of Le Sueur on County Road 36 (507) 665-3096 or 1-800-962-0047. Hours: Weekdays 8 am to 5 pm, Saturdays 9 am to 12 noon.

Nicollet County/North Mankato Recycling Center, 1139 Center Street, N. Mankato, (507) 625-1199. Hours: Weekdays 8 am to 5 pm, Saturdays 8 am to 3 pm, Sundays 11 am to 3 pm.

Both the Waste Management and the Nicollet County/North Mankato Recycling Center accept the following materials:

- Glass food and beverage containers
- Newspaper
- #1 & #2 plastic bottles
- Corrugated cardboard
- Aluminum & tin cans
- Textiles and old clothing
- Magazines & junk mail

The Nicollet County & Waste Management Recycling Centers also accept batteries, tires and appliances, but there is a fee charged for these items.

All cities in Sibley County have a drop-off recycling program, and most cities also have curbside recycling. Contact your city clerk for details on your community's program. Rural residents are encouraged to drop off their recyclables at one of the collection points in the county. Call the city closest to you to check on their recycling drop-off hours.

Solid Waste Transfer Stations & Landfills

The following facilities accept household garbage for a fee. Call for hours and current charges.

Minnesota Waste Processing Co. Transfer Station, 1051 Summit Avenue, Mankato, phone (507) 625-5746.

Waste Management Transfer Station, Located beside the Waste Management Recycling Center, four miles south of Le Sueur on County Road 36, (507) 665-3096 or 1-800-962-0047.

Ponderosa Landfill, just south of Mankato on County Roads 33 & 34 (507) 625-7301.

Spruce Ridge Landfill, Glencoe (320) 864-5503.

Demolition Landfills

Demolition materials include lumber, brick, shingles, siding, etc.

Household Hazardous Waste

Each year there are two household hazardous waste collection sites located in Sibley County. Residents can also take their household hazardous waste to the Regional Facility

located at 651 Summit Avenue in Mankato. The Regional Facility is open from April thru mid-November on Tuesdays from 12 noon to 6 pm and the 2nd & 4th Saturdays of each month from 9 am to 1 pm.



The collection sites accept items such as paint, household cleaners, thinners, old gasoline, lighter fluid, aerosols, glues, drain openers and garden chemicals. **NO business waste or agricultural waste will be accepted at these sites.**

Businesses are not eligible to participate in the household program. Businesses who have hazardous waste to dispose of can contact the Tri-County Solid Waste Office for assistance.

Used Motor Oil & Oil Filters

Check with your local retailer or service station to see if they will accept your used oil and filters or call the Tri-County Solid Waste Office to get a list of businesses that will accept these items. Motor oil and/or oil filters will not be accepted at the household hazardous waste collection sites.
